



Since the CAD upgrade in November, 2015, Active 911 has designated incidents with different abbreviations. Here are a few that you may encounter that have <u>less obvious</u> definitions:

	Fire Incidents that require EMS assistance default to Priority 2.
Law Enforcement incidents may at times be pushed	ALMC—Commercial Fire Alarm
over for Fire or EMS assistance. These default to Priority	ALMR—Residential Fire Alarm
2 incidents.	APTS- Apartment Fire
10-50—Motor Vehicle Accident without injuries	BRHR—Brush Fire Endangering a Structure
CIVIL—Civil Dispute	BURNVOL—Burn Violation
DISABLED— Disabled vehicle	CAM—Carbon Monoxide Alarm
DOMS—Domestic situation	COMM—Commercial Structure Fire
MED—Medical call initiated by Law Enforcement	FOLLOW– Rekindle previous fire
OTHER—	GASC–Gas Leak inside a structure
SERWAR–Warrant Service	GASL—Gas Leak outside a structure
SIG 11–Homicide	INDS—Industrial Accident
SIG 12–Sexual Assault	MA—Mutual Aid Request
SIG 13–Robbery	MVAC—Commercial Vehicle Accident
SIG 14–Assault	MVAT—Motor Vehicle Accident with Entrapment.
SIG 15—Breaking and Entering SIG 16—Larceny	PLNE—Plane Crash
SIG 17—Active Shooter	PS—Public Service call RESD—Residential Fire
SUSP—Activity, Person or Vehicle	SRCH—Search and Rescue
WELFARE—Welfare check request	TECHR—Technical Rescue

	UNKNOWN–Unknown incident

**ACHE**—Headache Specific

ALERT-Message sent through the system ARREST-Cardiac Arrest (always medical, never designates law enforcement) CARBMIN-Carbon monoxide inhalation ELECT-Electrocution GYNE-Childbirth complaint MENTAL-Psychiatric complaint MVA-Motor vehicle Accident OVERD-Overdose PARSE-An incident has been entered without enough information for Active 911 to properly code the call, resulting in only partial information. Invalid Code. RESP-Respiratory complaint SGPT- Stab or Gunshot complaint UNCON-Unconscious person
