Since the CAD upgrade in November, 2015, Active 911 has designated incidents with different abbreviations. Here are a few that you may encounter that have less obvious definitions:

Law Enforcement incidents may at times be pushed over for Fire or EMS assistance. These default to Priority 2 incidents.

10-50—Motor Vehicle Accident without injuries
CIVIL—Civil Dispute
DISABLED— Disabled vehicle
DOMS—Domestic situation
MED—Medical call initiated by Law Enforcement
OTHER—
SERWAR—Warrant Service
SIG 11—Homicide
SIG 12—Sexual Assault
SIG 13—Robbery
SIG 14—Assault
SIG 15—Breaking and Entering
SIG 16—Larceny
SIG 17—Active Shooter
SUSP—Activity, Person or Vehicle
WELFARE—Welfare check request

Fire Incidents that require EMS assistance default to Priority 2.

ALMC—Commercial Fire Alarm
ALMR—Residential Fire Alarm
APTS- Apartment Fire
BRHR—Brush Fire Endangering a Structure
BURNVOL—Burn Violation
CAM—Carbon Monoxide Alarm
COMM—Commercial Structure Fire
FOLLOW— Rekindle previous fire
GASC—Gas Leak inside a structure
GASL—Gas Leak outside a structure
INDS—Industrial Accident
MA—Mutual Aid Request
MVAC—Commercial Vehicle Accident
MVAT—Motor Vehicle Accident with Entrapment.
PLNE—Plane Crash
PS—Public Service call
RESD—Residential Fire
SRCH—Search and Rescue
TECHR—Technical Rescue
TRTL—Tractor Trailer Fire
UNKNOWN—Unknown incident

Please review **SOP 204.14** for full Emergency Medical Dispatch policies. EMS Calls will have a priority assigned.

ACHE—Headache Specific
ALERT—Message sent through the system
ARREST—Cardiac Arrest (always medical, never designates law enforcement)
CARBMIN—Carbon monoxide inhalation
ELECT—Electrocution
GYNE—Childbirth complaint
MENTAL—Psychiatric complaint
MVA—Motor vehicle Accident
OVERD—Overdose
PARSE—An incident has been entered without enough information for Active 911 to properly code the call, resulting in only partial information. Invalid Code.
RESP—Respiratory complaint
SGPT— Stab or Gunshot complaint
UNCON—Unconscious person
